

Luxe digs help soothe mixup

This weekend, Megadeth guitarist (and former Metallica guitarist) **Dave Mustaine** brought back some rock 'n' roll glamour to the penthouse at the Stoneleigh Hotel.

Once upon a time, Hard Rock Cafe founder **Isaac Tigrett** lived in the 7,000-square-foot-plus penthouse like a pasha welcoming guitar-wielding royals such as Stevie Ray Vaughan and **Joe Walsh**. Three years ago, when the Stoneleigh got an impressive \$36 million remodel, the penthouse was restored to its 1930s glory, but the bedrooms were set off as separate hotel rooms.

The plush penthouse helped lift his mood after a comedy of errors that wasn't that funny if you're one of the greatest (if not the greatest) metal guitarists of all time.
